

The “NJNEOA Nomads” Motorcycle Club

The NJNEOA is a non-profit fraternal organization consisting of active and retired law enforcement officers.

The New Jersey Narcotic Enforcement Officers Association was formed in 1965 by a small group of law enforcement officers and citizens who were concerned about the growing problem of drug abuse and how it was affecting children, families and society itself.

For over twenty years the NJNEOA has encouraged mutual co-operation, discussion and interest in the problems of enforcement concerning drug abuse. It has sponsored seminars and conferences in an attempt to educate those involved in the abatement of the illegal narcotic trade.

In addition, the NJNEOA encourages the education of both students and teachers about the dangers of substance abuse as a way of reducing the demand side of the problem.

Along with maintaining its website which is located at www.njneoa.com, the association publishes a quarterly newspaper as a means of conveying the latest legal updates and current drug trends to its law enforcement members.

Besides hosting several charitable fund raising events throughout the year and sponsoring a scholarship program for the children of NJNEOA members who are planning on attending college, the NJNEOA has formed the NJNEOA Motorcycle Club whose members are known as “The NJNEOA Nomads.”

The club began to take applications for membership in the spring of 2007. Membership is open to both active and retired law enforcement officers who enjoy riding motorcycles.

The purpose and goals of “The NJNEOA Nomads” are:

- To provide for the mutual assistance, enjoyment, education, physical, mental and social benefit of its members and the public.
- To promote and advance the sport and safety of motorcycling.
- To serve the interests of motorcycle owners and riders.
- To develop a fraternal spirit between law enforcement personnel and the public.
- To raise funds through events such as motorcycle runs for several charities and other organizations such as the Milltown American Legion and the Kenilworth Veteran Center.

To qualify for membership you must:

- Be an active full time law enforcement officer with powers of arrest.
- Be employed by a governmental agency and receive monetary compensation, or be a retired or disabled former law enforcement officer.
- Possess a valid license to operate a motorcycle.
- Own a motorcycle or plan to purchase one within six months.
- Be a current member in good standing of the NJNEOA, or an initial thirty-five dollar (\$35.00) membership fee will afford an applicant joint membership to both “The NJNEOA Nomads” as well as one year dues to the NJNEOA. Future year’s membership then only requires the payment of the normal NJNEOA dues.
